WATER DIVISION OPERATOR

The Southborough Department of Public Works is receiving applications from mature and versatile individuals for an open position in the Water Division.

The position involves work in all Southborough Public Works Divisions with a primary assignment to the Water Division. Work includes typical Water Division operations including water sampling, water meter reading installation and replacement, construction oversight, repair and maintenance of water mains and services, hydrant installation, repair and maintenance, water easement maintenance, and pumping station operation and maintenance. Work also includes other Public Works operations including, but not limited to, sanding, snow plowing, roadway maintenance, transfer station operations, cemetery maintenance and assisting with interments.

Candidates must be able to obtain, at a minimum, a Class I D OIT water license within nine months of employment and obtain a Class II D full water license within three years of employment. All candidates must possess a Class A, with air brakes Commercial Drivers License or be able to obtain one within six months of employment. A Class 2A hoisting License is preferred, candidates must be able to obtain at least a 2A hoisting license within 12 months of employment. Candidates also must be qualified, through training and experience, in the operation of all automotive equipment. A basic mechanical knowledge and background in water system maintenance and construction as well as general Public Works maintenance and construction is preferable. Job Title and Grade based on years relevant experience and licensure. Starting hourly pay range is \$23.75 to \$28.82 per hour based on years of relevant experience, licensure and Job Grade and Job Title.
