DEFINITION

Supervisory work in the production of high quality, safe drinking water and the maintenance of water treatment plant equipment; all other related work as required.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

Works under direct supervision of Public Works Director or Deputy Public Works Director, performing the following functions:

- Exercises considerable judgment as to work methods and assignments, adopting or modifying methods and procedures to meet changing conditions.
- Makes occasional contacts with the Police Department, Town officials, state and federal agencies and general public.
- Supervises and instructs all Water Treatment Plant personnel in methods of performing tasks which are pertinent to the job.
- Work requires the use of independent judgment to maintain safe water and avoid damage to equipment.
- Errors could jeopardize personal and public safety, damage equipment or cause excessive costs. Work in general is performed under typical shop conditions, but with occasional heavy physical effort, including lifting 110 lb. drums.
- Supervises the operation and maintenance of the water treatment plants.
- Supervises and trains water treatment plant operators and attendants.
- Tests water quality and laboratory equipment.
- Operates valves, pumps, motors and chemical pumps; checks equipment used in treatment process and remote wells; maintains lime slurry piping system and sump pump.
- Takes and records readings of instruments monitoring treatment process; maintains operation logs and maintenance and repair records.
- Monitors chemical usage; calibrates chemical solution pumps and chemical dry feeders; adds treatment chemicals as needed; handles chlorine cylinders.
- Schedules, takes, prepares and packages various water quality samples for delivery to laboratories.
- Performs regularly scheduled preventive maintenance on plant machinery and equipment.
- Maintains a clean and orderly condition of the treatment plant and well buildings; provides general custodial care of grounds and buildings.
- Ensures that stocks of chemicals, laboratory equipment and other necessary equipment are adequate.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

High School graduation; five years experience in water field with emphasis on treatment activities; or any

equivalent combination of education and experience.

KNOWLEDGE, ABILITY, AND SKILL

Considerable knowledge of treatment plant operation and maintenance. Mechanical ability. Ability to motivate, communicate with and lead employees. Ability to follow oral and written instructions. Ability to deal with contracts and maintain good public relations. Minimum Drinking Water Supply Facilities License Grade III (Treatment) required, Grade IV preferred.
